A MODEL FOR EXCELLENT CURRICULUM DESIGN

Content-specific

- Every piece of knowledge and every skill that students will master in each unit of work will be meticulously specified, along with precise definitions.

Cumulative

- Knowledge and skills are intelligently sequenced and ordered for optimal instruction, ensuring longer time is prioritized for the development of depth and sufficient practice to embed learning. Knowledge and skills from previous units is revisited explicitly and systematically and interleaved to build retention.

Coherence

- Instructional sequences are consistently planned and delivered across all stages to ensure students acquire and demonstrate a sufficient grasp of the knowledge, understanding and skills relevant to their year group. Learning objectives for every lesson are explicit.

Challenge

- All students are challenged through depth, but also supported through careful scaffolding. All students are expected to become 'experts' in each key idea.
